## 11 Days | Anchorage to Fairbanks

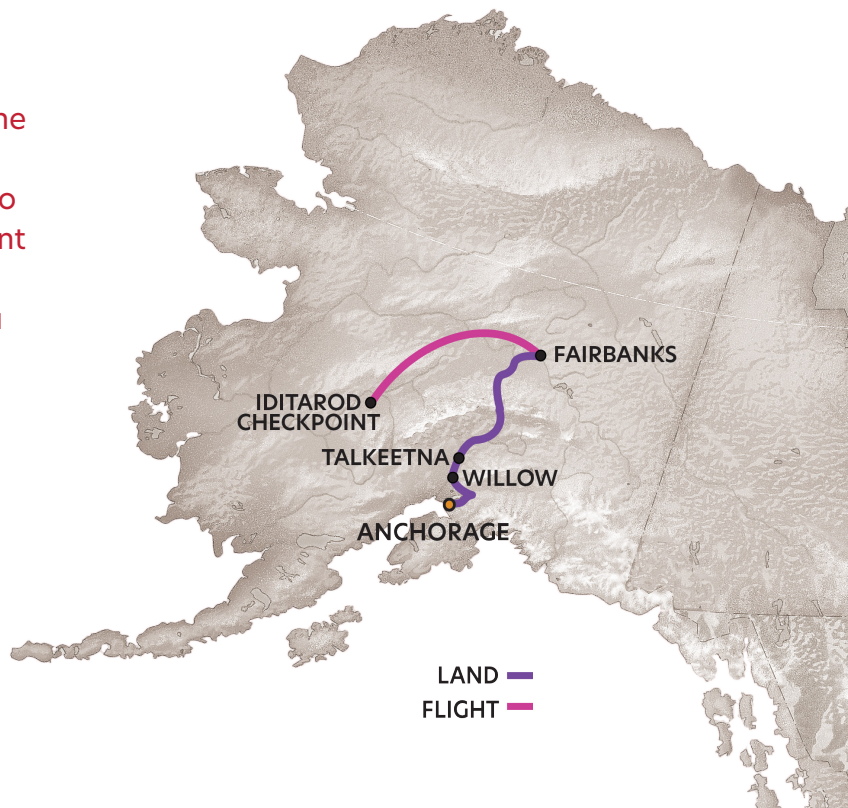

### 1 Anchorage

### 4 The Iditarod Ceremonial Start

**IMPORTANT TOUR NOTE:** Guests may forgo the Iditarod checkpoint trip and receive a \$1700 per person credit to their account. While this is an amazing experience, John Hall's Alaska understands small planes may not be for everyone. Eliminating the flightseeing trip, per person pricing is \$10,319 double occupancy, \$12,299 single occupancy.
